WATKINS FAMILY HOUR

Performing Saturday, April 2, 8:00 PM



Moving from one landscape to the next – literally and musically – is nothing new to Sean and Sara Watkins, who have performed separately and together for nearly their whole lives. As young adults, they (along with mandolinist Chris Thile) broke out nationally as Nickel Creek, an acoustic ensemble that sold millions of albums, won a Grammy, and toured the world. As Watkins Family Hour, their newest album "Brother Sister" is a duo-centric record – yet one that feels bigger than just two people.



TISH HINOJOSA

Performing Sunday, April 3, 6:00 PM

Tish Hinojosa is a Mexican-American Singer Songwriter whose songs blend the genres of country, folk and Hispanic music in a way that can only be described as a musical melting pot; unique and insightful. Her songs have been covered by other artists; she has written and worked with, Peter Rowan, Joan Baez, Chris Hillman, Booker T. Jones, Kris Kristofferson and Pete Seeger. The Chicago Tribune put it succinctly: "Simply put, Hinojosa is a first-class songwriter."



VANCE GILBERT

Performing Saturday, April 2, 7:00 PM

Considered by many to be an integral part of the national folk scene, Vance Gilbert's approach to the acoustic singer-songwriter idiom is significant. Gilbert's songs are characterized by sophisticated melodies and harmonies with a storyteller's touch. His remarkable rapport with his audiences and his free spirited performances inspired one critic to hail him as "a voice that could have been on the opera stage and a wit that could have been on a comedy stage".

BIRDS & ARROWS

Andrea and Pete Connolly of Birds and Arrows have been making music together for more than 15 years, and this familiarity and cohesion certainly shows. Their sound and art direction make them seem much larger than a duo, churning out music that can jump from personal ballads to massive jams that threaten to swallow the performers up. Their tight harmonies and melody driven songs make them span many genres from rock to folk to pop. Their music is contemplative and a little psychedelic.



CARY MORIN

Described as "one of the best acoustic pickers on the scene today," Cary Morin brings together the great musical traditions of America and beyond like no other. Chris Brashear and Peter McLaughlin are prolific songwriters, having performed and recorded together for over twenty years. Their previous duet recordings, *Canyoneers* (2003) and *So Long Arizona* (2008), established them as leading performance artists and creative lyricists with a particular interest in celebrating, chronicling and lamenting, the joys, sorrows and historic significance of the Southwest.



CURLEY TAYLOR & ZYDECO TROUBLE

Louisiana native Curley Taylor's bluesy, soulful vocals and the band's hard driving Zydeco beat blend to create high-energy dance music for all audiences. Curley's music is true to its roots in Zydeco and Blues, but contemporary enough to appeal to a broad range of music lovers. Offbeat Magazine calls the group "part of the movement ushering in a new era of zydeco. It's not even close to your father's zydeco, but Taylor aims to be your zydeco daddy".

Hindsight is 20/20, they say, but foresight is even better. And Nashville's powerful husband/wife duo Freddy & Francine had just that, while writing their new album *I Am Afraid to Die!* in the beginning of 2020. Leaning heavily into the duo's soul and R&B roots and featuring their powerful vocals, *I Am Afraid to Die!*, the duo's seventh album, was recorded in Nashville after a successful \$25,000 Kickstarter campaign and released in September 2020.



GABRIEL NAÏM AMOR & BETH GOODFELLOW

French-born, Parisian musician Gabriel Naim Amor is a chameleon of a musician whose solo albums outline a constellation of artistic innovation. It was his 2018 CD 'Hear The Walls' that grabbed the attention of Los Angeles-based drummer/singer-songwriter Beth Goodfellow (Iron and Wine, Madison Cunningham, Allison Russell). She reached out to Naim to collaborate in January 2021, bringing her marimba to Naim's studio in Tucson where the two began crafting a uniquely fresh sound.



JC & LANEY

JC & Laney are seasoned high energy Acoustic Folk Rock Balladeers. Since 2009 they are well known for their trademark harmonies, playful banter, memorable toe tapping & heart throbbing original songs. JC is an accomplished acoustic guitar player, vocalist & songwriter and Laney will steal your heart away with her amazing vocals. With 7 CD releases; they were chosen for the 1st round of the 2016 Grammy Awards.

2022 FINALISTS

BRETT ALTMAN – New York City, New York

Brett Altman is a singer-songwriter based just outside of New York City. A self-described late bloomer, Brett didn't first perform publicly until the age of 20. Now, he can't get enough of playing and connecting with new communities. His upbeat music is a fusion of pop and folk, with songwriting that illuminates moments of everyday life.

NICO BARBERAN – Chicago, Illinois (Tucson, AZ)

Nico Barberan is an eclectic guitarist, composer, and music instructor born in Santiago, Chile. Nico moved to Chicago, to immerse himself in the city's diverse music scene, stepping on important Chicago stages and festivals. He has a unique, inspirational guitar style that stems from a playful attitude towards music and an extraordinary ability to incorporate music from his homeland and other South American countries.

CHRIS BARON – Pacific Northwest

Chris Baron hails from the Pacific Northwest. When he picks his favs, he always pick 'the quirky song' on an album. But it has to have a certain prettiness. For his original songs, Baron likes surprises and subtle messages. He is excited by the different compositional choices a songwriter makes between a recorded album, and a live performance.

MARK HOLDAWAY – Tucson, Arizona

Mark Holdaway is best known as the "Kalinka Guy", but he has been playing guitar-based folk and world music in Tucson since he arrived here in 1995. After several years of submitting songwriting applications, he has been recognized as a Tucson Folk Festival songwriting finalist in 2021 and 2022. His songs explore as wide ranging topics as gender issues to the weather.

KATHLEEN KELSO – Los Angeles, California

Kathleen Kelso, 25, is an LA-based singer-songwriter who spends her time making observations about the world, then making them rhyme. A born performer, she has a charming onstage presence that balances out the melancholy found in many of her songs.

CORRIE LYNN GREEN – Virginia

Corrie Lynn Green is an Appalachian singer from the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia. She is a singer songwriter bringing her unique perspective of life in the hollow towns surrounded by the Shenandoah National Park.

ALLISON LEAH – Nashville, Tennessee

With just a guitar in hand, "Allison's style makes any performance feel as intimate and honest as the words in her songs" (Lightning 100). Allison Leah is a folk-pop singer-songwriter based in Nashville, TN. While her ethereal melodies and crystal clear voice will hook you in, it is the message of her music that will keep you coming back for more.

KAY MIRACLE – New York / Washington

Kay Miracle is an Americana Troubadour with over 200 original songs. She lives in both New York and WA State and finds her muse on the train rails across America. Kay uses songwriting to heal PTSD with Veterans and help victims of trauma to find their voice using music for healing. Kay has won numerous songwriting awards in New York, Washington DC, and WA State.

GABRIELLE PIETRANGELO – Tucson, Arizona

Gabrielle Pietrangelo is an independent musician based in Tucson. After releasing one solo album early in her career, Pietrangelo immersed herself for many years in harmony-driven collaborations, including Silver Thread Trio and Sister Solace. Her 2020 EP release, *On My Way Back Home*, marked a return to roots of solo performance, guitar-driven arrangements, fingerpicking, open tuning, and ethereal melodies and harmonies.

TERRITORY & HOMBRE – Tucson, Arizona

Territory & Hombre are Terry and Tobin Kite, two brothers from Saguaro National Monument East. Their music is written and recorded around the dinner table after the family meal every Sunday. The songs are then mostly ignored and forgotten, so they are excited to be able to share some of them at the Festival. They have won no awards and have had to be physically escorted out of public gatherings on more than one occasion.

Roger Mikulas was a strong supporter and one of the originators of the Young Artist Stage that began in 2006. He passed away in 2010, but his larger-than-life spirit is still remembered and inspires the provision and teaching of folk music for young people today.
